What: TREBUNIE TUTKI – Christmas carols

We invite you to join our Christmas carols concert in the atmosphere of the legendary world of the Polish Tatra Mountains. The event will be hosted by the Ochota Cultural Centre and the St. James' Church.

Trebuie Tutki is a Polish family folk group. At the beginning it was a regional folk group, now it has become a group that is present during the biggest and most important festivals of world music in Europe as well as in Asia and North America. The group members are very faithful to the tradition of local highlanders, but this fact does not prevent them from being more and more creative. By using traditional instruments and basing on musical shape and character of the highlanders' music they have created New Highlander Music. They developed and added some new melodies and texts telling about every-day problems as well as avant-garde arrangements. They like experimenting, they often cooperate with such artists like Twinkle Brothers – the band from Jamaica, Ordo Sakhna – the band from Kyrgyzstan, Andrew Cronshaw from England and many famous Polish artists. A very important role play unique instruments: shepherds' flutes and pipes, złóbcoki – narrow old-fiddle, koza – a local bagpipe, trombita – the long wooden trumpet and others.
